PROFILE GUIDELINES

The Profile Section is a trademark feature of *Mediterranean Politics*. Its purpose is to provide readers with regular expert opinions on recent developments in the region and to contribute to ongoing debates.

The defining characteristics of a Profile are as follows:

- Relatively short pieces not exceeding 3,000 words.
- In-depth analysis reflecting expert opinion on the long-term significance of events.
- Deal with topical issues (e.g. elections), emerging trends (e.g. economic, foreign and domestic policies) and landmark events (e.g. regional summits/conferences, launch of policy initiatives) of relevance to the Mediterranean writ large.
- Generally appear without references (or very few, e.g. if essential to the credibility of the interpretation).

To maximise the added value of Profiles, the commissioning process takes place as close as possible to the publication deadlines. The average timeframe allowed for the drafting of Profiles is 4 weeks, though this can vary depending on selected topics and author preferences. These modalities are determined in advance by the prospective authors and the Deputy Editor of the journal, who oversees the commissioning process.

Although topics of Profiles are identified in advance by the Editorial Board of the journal, ideas from possible authors are welcome and can be submitted to the Deputy Editor by email (profiles@mediterranean-politics.com).

Mediterranean Politics does not offer honoraria for authors of Profiles, but gives them the opportunity to get published in a prestigious international journal, listed on the Thomson Reuters Social Sciences Citation Index, with thousands of readers all over the world.
