

# Orbit

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**Preparation of Manuscripts.** Submit one original and two copies of the manuscript, one sharp photographic print of line drawings with two copies, and three sharp prints of other photographic illustrations together with the complete article on disk. Type the manuscript double-spaced, on one side only, with ample margins. The letter of submission should be signed by all authors. Before any accepted manuscript can be forwarded to the publisher, a copyright agreement form must be signed.

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*Research Reports:* Research reports are original 'peer-reviewed' papers pertaining to basic and clinical research related to the fields of (peri-)orbital dis-eases/surgery, ophthalmic plastic and reconstructive surgery, and lacrimal surgery.

*Case Reports:* Case Reports include original clinical descriptions of one or more patients presenting with a disease entity within the scope of the Journal. The reports may contain the description of not previously described clinical features. They may also deal with pilot studies covering diagnostic or therapeutic aspects of clinical diseases. They should be no more than 750 words in length. No more than two illustrations or tables should be provided. It should be comprised of three sections: Introduction (no heading required), Case Report, and Comment. No more than 10 references should be cited.

*Reviews:* Reviews provide an overview of recent literature on selected well circumscribed topics relevant to those active in the field of the orbit and adnexa.
