

Guidelines for Book Reviewers

Quantitative Finance aims to publish Book Reviews that are of interest to the broad readership of the Journal including: practitioners, academics working in economics and finance, and scientists from related subject disciplines. Book Reviews are intended to:

- Provide readers with a clear overview of the content of the book under review
- Present the evidence, arguments, methodology and overall conclusions of the book in a fair and accurate manner
- Engage readers with an accessible, lively writing style
- Place the book within the wider context of the existing literature and research in the subject being studied

Book Reviews should not exceed 1,000 words.

All book reviews should be preceded by full publication information, which should include (in the following order):

- ISBN number(s)
- book title (in bold type)
- author(s)/editor(s)
- publisher
- year of publication
- paperback/hardback or e-book

Your name should appear at the end of the review.

Example:

ISBN 0-415-10356; 0-415-10357-6.

by Rasheed El-Enany. Routledge, 1993, Paperback.

Your electronic invitation to review includes a link to our online submissions system (Scholar One Manuscripts). After logging on, please find an entry for the book you are reviewing within your 'Author Centre' and submit the completed review according to the instructions. The review will then be edited and made ready for publication.
