

Instructions for Authors – Scandinavian Journal of Food and Nutrition

Preparing for Submission

Submitted manuscripts should be arranged according to the rules stated in "Uniform requirements for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals" *Ann Intern Med* 1997; 126: 36-47, or *JAMA* 1997; 277: 927-34. The full document is available at www.icmje.org. When submitting a paper, the author should always make a full statement to the editor about all submissions and previous reports that might be regarded as redundant or duplicate publication of the same or very similar work.

Conflict of interest and funding

Authors are responsible for recognising and disclosing financial and other conflicts of interest that might bias their work. They should acknowledge all financial support for the work and other financial or personal connections to the work.

Statistic validity

If statistical data are provided the authors are requested to submit an official statement issued by a certified statistician (with a proper affiliation) regarding the validity of methods used.

Ethics and consent

When reporting experiments on human subjects, indicate whether the procedures followed were in accordance with the ethical standards of the responsible committee on human experimentation and with the Helsinki Declaration of 1975, as revised in 1983. Do not use patients' names, initials, or hospital numbers, especially in illustrative material. Papers including animal experiments or clinical trials must be accompanied by an approval by the local ethics committee. Please give date of issue and registration number.

Identifying information should not be published in written descriptions, photographs, and pedigrees unless the information is essential for scientific purposes and the patient (or parent or guardian) gives written informed consent for publication. Informed consent for this purpose requires that the patient be shown the manuscript to be published.

Submission

Language

All articles should be written in British English. SI units should be used.

Manuscript Length

Manuscripts estimated to exceed 8 printed pages, including figures and tables, are generally not accepted. However, longer manuscripts may be published as a Supplement and will also undergo regular peer review.

I: Electronic Manuscript

The editors encourage submission by e-mail for rapid handling. In addition to the e-mail version one hard copy and a diskette of all material, including illustrations and tables should be submitted to the editorial office.

The electronic manuscript should be accompanied by a covering letter as described above along with a clear indication of the computer platform and version of word processing system used. Please use this simple guideline for preparing your electronic manuscript:

1. Be consistent. The same elements should be keyed in exactly the same way throughout the manuscript.
2. Do not break words at the end of lines. Use a hyphen only to hyphenate compound words.
3. Enter only one space after the full-stop at the end of a sentence.
4. When emphasising words please use the italic feature of your word processor software.
5. Do not justify your text; use a ragged right-hand margin.
6. Use a double hyphen (--) to indicate a dash in text.
7. Do not use the lowercase l for 1 (one) or the uppercase O for 0 (zero).

8. The space bar should only be used as a word separator. Use TAB when identifying paragraphs or separating columns in tables.
9. Please observe that the Editorial offices and Taylor & Francis can receive files from many word processing systems; however, styled Microsoft Word files are preferred.

Illustrations

Keep illustrations as separate files. Acceptable media: Zipdisk, 3.5 floppy disk, CD, Ftp service, e-mail. Platforms supported: Mac, Windows 95, 98 and 2000, Windows NT & XP.

Acceptable formats*: TIFF, JPEG, PDF, GIF, BMP, EPS (resolution independent files), Quark Express, Word documents*, Excel, Powerpoint. Compression: PKZIP or WINZIP for windows, Stuffit for Mac, any self-extracting compressions software. Software used: Conversion Plus, Adobe Acrobat 6 and 7, Adobe Illustrator, Adobe Photoshop to edit/manipulate scanned/electronic images

II: Manuscript on paper

Submit one hard copies and a diskette of all material, including illustrations and tables. No manuscripts are accepted without an electronic copy provided.

Illustrations

Submit unmounted illustrations. Half tone and colour photos should be professionally drawn or photographed but computer-drawn figures are also accepted provided they are of high quality. Figure legends should be written on a separate sheet of paper. Figure number and arrow indicating 'top' should be written on an adhesive label on the back of all illustrations.

Manuscript Layout

Wherever possible, the paper should follow the traditional layout: introduction (motivation, problem identification and a short literature survey), present investigation (background, method, materials, subjects and results)

Organise the paper: title page, abstract page, introduction, material and methods, results, discussion, acknowledgements, list of references.

Double-space the entire manuscript - even the reference list - and leave generous margins. Begin each section, including figure and table legends, on separate sheets and type the page number in the upper right-hand corner of each page.

Title page should include:

1) title of manuscript, 2) name of author(s), 3) name and address of department(s) and institution(s), and 4) a 'running title' of no more than 50 characters.

The author who made the greatest contribution to the paper should be listed first. In addition the nature of the contribution of each investigator should be briefly described. One contributor should be identified as "Guarantor" for all parts of the paper. The name, address, telephone, fax number and e-mail address of the guarantor to whom the proofs are to be sent, should appear at the bottom of the page.

Abstract

The abstract (max. 200 words) should be written on a separate page and structured: Background, Objective, Design, Results, Conclusions. It should be followed by 5-6 key words (avoid words already used in the title).

References

The Vancouver system must be applied. The number of references in original articles should generally not exceed 25-30. Number the references consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Identify references in the text by arabic numerals (in parentheses). List the first six authors followed by et al. Papers accepted but not yet published should be designated as (in press). Information from papers in manuscript but not yet accepted should be cited in the text as "unpublished observation(s)" or "personal communication".
