Publications from the same author in a single year should use a, b, c, etc. Where there are three or more authors, the text citation should give only the first author followed by “ <i>et al.</i> ”
Reference list	References should be listed alphabetically, then chronologically at the end of the article. Journal titles should <i>not</i> be abbreviated.
