Spelling preferences	British spelling should be used throughout. Common foreign words such as regime, role, elite are to be unaccented. The -ise ending (in recognise, organise, realise, etc.) is preferred; per cent, not %.
Abbreviations	Capitals should be used sparingly, as for departments of state, but not office-holders, and where they may be necessary to avoid ambiguity.

Punctuation	Quotations should be in single quotation marks, double within single, and the closing quotation mark should precede the punctuation, except where a complete sentence is quoted. Long quotations of five or more lines should be indented without parenthesis.

Dates	Dates should be given in the form: 28 January 1912; 1914–18; the 1930s. In notes, the name of all months except March–July inclusive should be abbreviated.
References in text	The references should be given in shortened form in a footnote or endnote with a full version given in the list of references at the end of the article. Note reference numbers should appear as superior numerals following any punctuation marks (except the dash which they should precede). The Notes should be given in abbreviated form as Name, Short title, pages: Smith, <i>East towards Home</i> , 34. Jones, “Title of Article,” 948.
