

GNPL supplementary material checks

SUPPLEMENTARY MATERIAL must appear at the top of the first page (bold, in caps, left aligned)

Title (bold), authors (not bold, 'and' with no comma between last two authors), affiliations (italic) should all be left aligned. These parts should appear as they do in the published papers.

Abstract and keywords should be identical to the submitted paper.

Spellings throughout should be UK (-ise), i.e. no 'z' spellings such as 'analyze' (this should be 'analyse').

Any text (if appearing as supplementary material) should be numbered (1., 2. etc), and should appear first, before tables and figures. The heading levels should look the same as in published papers, i.e.

A heading (bold)

B heading (bold, italic)

C heading (italic)

D heading. Text runs on

Figures and tables should be labelled Figure S1, Table S1, etc. (no variation on this, such as 1S, is acceptable). As much as possible the tables should be formatted to the style that appears in the published papers.

Any references appearing in the supplementary material should be provided at the end of the supplementary material in journal style. These should be cross-checked with the submitted paper to ensure no references are:

- a) missing in the submission, or
- b) additional to the submission (i.e. are relevant to the supplementary material only)
