
Instructions to Authors

Fetal & Pediatric Pathology invites original articles relating to experimental, anatomic, and laboratory aspects of embryology, teratology, placentology, gestational and perinatal diseases, growth and development. The pathology of pediatrics and the pediatric subspecialties, pediatric oncology and hematology, and articles concerning pediatric pathology education are of interest. Case reports are published *only* if they provide new information *or new insights into the histology of disease*. Editorials, review articles, annotated bibliographies, letters, book reviews, pathology teach and tell reports, and proceedings of clinicopathologic conferences are published at the discretion of the Editor. Abstracts of pediatric pathology meetings and society announcements are published by prior arrangement with the Editor.

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Editorial policy is set by the Editor and Editorial Board. Manuscripts are reviewed by at least two referees. Manuscripts should be submitted in hard copy triplicate and on floppy disk to the Editor-in-Chief, Dr. Enid Gilbert-Barness, Tampa General Hospital, Department of Pathology, 2 Columbia Drive, Davis Island, Tampa, FL 33606; or Dr. Atilano G. 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Abstract. Each paper should be summarized in an abstract of not more than 150 words. Avoid abbreviations, diagrams, and reference to the text.
