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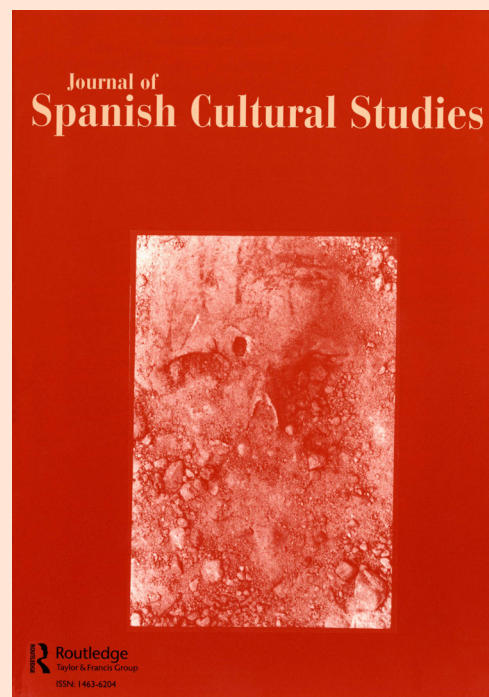
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The Journal of Spanish Cultural Studies is an international peer-reviewed journal that interrogates established notions of Spanish culture and Hispanism by publishing innovative theoretical and critical work of the highest quality. It promotes the study of previously marginalized areas of Spanish culture, and research which rethinks the cultural meanings of canonical texts, in relation to all historical periods. Work across disciplinary and national boundaries is encouraged.

The Editors welcome the submission of articles and proposals for monographic issues, position papers, interviews, and review articles. Articles should normally be between 7,000-8,500 words; position papers and interviews, 2,000-4,000 words; and reviews of individual books, 700-1,000 words. Material may be published in English or Spanish, with quotations in the original language (in the case of Basque, Catalan, and Galician, an English or Spanish translation should also be given). All articles are peer reviewed.

References within the text should follow the MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers, by giving the author's name and title of publication (if needed) in parenthesis, as appropriate. All references cited in the text should be listed in full at the end of the paper, under the heading 'Works cited'.
