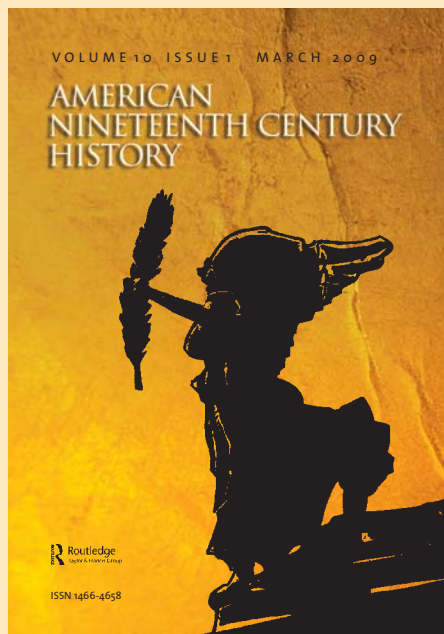


AMERICAN NINETEENTH CENTURY HISTORY



CALL FOR PAPERS: The American Civil War

The sesquicentennial of the American Civil War, beginning in 2011, following closely as it does the Lincoln bicentennial of 2009, will see even more academic and public interest in the Civil War than usual. This will be an exciting time for all historians of nineteenth-century America, and in recognition of this *American Nineteenth Century History* proposes to contribute to what promises to be a stimulating four years of debate and discussion with at least one Special Issue of the journal devoted—in broad terms—to the ‘war between the states’.

We therefore invite papers and shorter ‘Notes and Comments’ on any aspect of the Civil War era, but are particularly interested to encourage and disseminate fresh approaches to the conflict, including, but certainly not exclusively: gender and the Civil War; the soldiers’ experience of battle; ethnic regiments in the conflict; religion and the war; the ‘home-front’; the naval war; the war in global context; nationalism North and South; and the war’s immediate and longer-term cultural aftermath and impact. Since we have a four-year period ahead of us, shorter analysis of the sesquicentennial event itself—the broader cultural expressions of and responses to this in the United States and abroad—will also be considered.

The initial deadline for proposals is 20th December 2010, with a view to publication in 2011.
