All submitted material is subject to a process of assessment and evaluation through the Editors and through peer review.

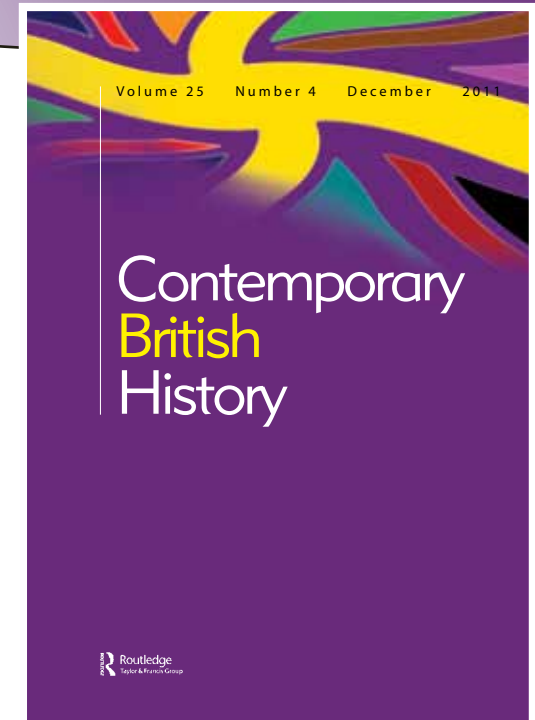
The journal has a long-established reputation in the fields of political and diplomatic history. In recent years it has broadened its horizons to encompass cultural, social, imperial and economic themes (see for example the special issue on 'Affluence'). The Editors welcome contributions from non-historians (political scientists, sociologists, etc). They are also keen to receive submissions whose focus is regional/local rather than just national, providing the work in question is attuned to broader debates and controversies in British history (for example the journal is emerging as a leading forum for debate on the 'troubles' in Northern Ireland).
