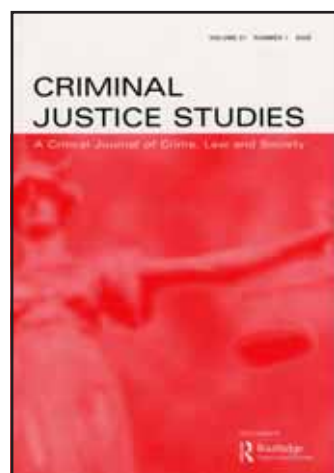

Qualitative and quantifiable articles are sought mainly from academics and research in the field, though articles from professionals may also be considered.
