What We Publish

We encourage proposals for research articles, commentaries, notes from the field, book review essays, works of fiction, and translations. Full-length research articles should range between 7,000 and 15,000 words, while commentaries are shorter pieces aimed at a current topic of importance in the Asian region. Notes from the field, like commentaries, are aimed at generating discussion by raising questions and offering contingent findings. Book review essay proposals should examine at least two books in a comparative manner. Works of fiction, including poetry and song lyrics, are welcome, particularly in translation. Finally, "translations" is aimed at addressing the continued hegemony of the English language in academic publishing, including on Asian matters. We seek to provide a platform for scholars and others writing in indigenous languages and who may not have access to an international audience. We therefore invite proposals for topical essays on books and essays published in indigenous languages in the broad Asian region.
