

Praxis Call for Papers

A crucial component of engaged and ethical environmental communication is the critical examination of practice. Grounded in specific contexts, the ongoing cycle of reflection and action—or praxis—can provide insights about not only what has been done, but also why, how, and with what degree of success. Ideally, we believe such work can enhance the quality of environmental communication in academic and other professional contexts, as well as ultimately foster beneficial change in the world. To that end, this section of the journal will showcase exemplary critical resources, tools, reports, reviews, and dialogues drawn from environmental communication expertise in activism, pedagogy, and professional practices more broadly. We envision contributions that are distinct from traditional scholarly articles, and that may include, but are not limited to: interviews, discussion fora, critical resources (e.g., materials developed for professional settings), media reviews (e.g., of books or environmental films), annotated reference lists (e.g., alternative media resources or training centers), innovative pedagogical exercises, and successful activist tools. We also are soliciting black and white images of environmental praxis for the cover of the journal with artist and practitioner statements. All submissions should take into consideration the journal's interdisciplinary and international audience. Formatting should follow the journal's guidelines, and authors should include a brief biographical note with contact information.
