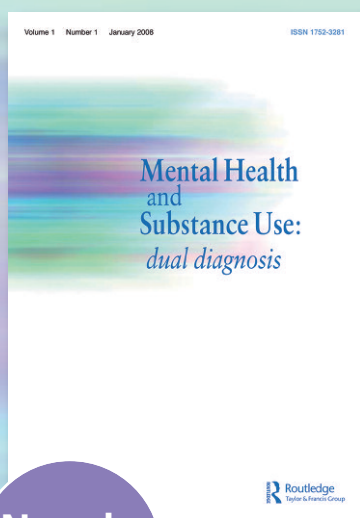

The journal welcomes a range of contributions. The following will be considered for publication:

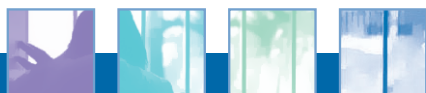
- Reports of research and innovative practice.
