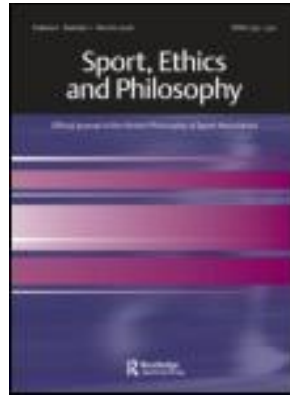

Olympic Ethics and Philosophy - Special Issue in 2012

Call for Papers



The publisher of *Sport, Ethics and Philosophy*, Routledge, intend to produce a set of Olympics themed special issues of several of their journals to serve as a unique collection and become part of the educational legacy of the Olympic and Paralympic Games to be staged in London in 2012. It is intended that most, if not all, of the special issues will be launched together at the International Convention on Science, Education and Medicine in Sport (ICSEMIS) to be held in July 2012 in Glasgow, shortly before the start of the London Olympic and Paralympic Games on 27 July.

A special issue of the journal *Sport, Ethics and Philosophy* (www.informaworld.com/rsep) will be produced for 2012, edited by Mike McNamee. *Olympic Ethics and Philosophy* will be exclusively devoted to philosophical essays relating to Olympism and issues related to the Olympic Games. Discussions may focus on matters Olympic and/or Paralympic. The essays are not restricted to any school or branch of philosophy. Essays will be selected on their intrinsic philosophical merit and the balance of the overall volume. It is expected that between 10 and 12 essays will be published in the volume. Final papers should be between 5000-8000 words. The essays will typically draw upon and develop work in aesthetics, ethics, and social or political philosophy. Proposals beyond these fields may also be considered.

Papers must be prepared in English. The Editor is keen to encourage contributors for whom English is not their native language to submit early abstracts and versions of papers for comment and for advice on language issues.

Papers to be submitted for the special issue must follow a strict timetable set out below. Owing to the very tight production timetable for all the special issues, there is no room for negotiation over submission dates.

Please note that *papers not entirely finalized by May 31st 2011 cannot be included.*

Guidelines for Abstracts and Contributions

- Abstract of paper to the Editor (350 words) final date
- Authors will receive notification
- The submission deadline (absolute) for accepted papers
- Preferred format is MS Word
