Sanjaya Lall Prize for Student Submissions

The Editorial Board is glad to announce that there will be a Sanjaya Lall Student Prize for the best article published in ODS by a student. The rules for this prize are as follows:

1. **Eligibility:** all registered graduate students resident anywhere in the world who have published an article in ODS, subject to the following two provisos:
2. **Proviso:** the author must be a registered graduate student, and declare this fact, at the time of initial submission of the article to ODS;
3. **Proviso:** in the case of joint or multiple authors, both or all authors must have, and declare, registered graduate student status at the time of submission.
4. **Periodicity:** the Prize will be awarded every two years, the first award being in 2011, and all eligible articles in the previous two volumes will be considered.
5. **Amount:** the Prize will be £1,000 in cash.
6. **Criterion:** the Prize will be awarded to the article among those eligible which, in the view of judges appointed by the Editorial Board, has made the best all-round contribution to development studies, subject to the following provisos:
7. **Proviso:** no prize will be awarded if the judges decide that there is no eligible article in the two previous volumes of sufficient merit.
8. **Proviso:** the author(s) of the winning entry must provide evidence satisfactory to the Board of graduate student status at the time of initial submission.
9. **Notification:** the Prize will be advertised on the ODS and DSA websites. The names of the winners will be published on these websites and in the journal.
