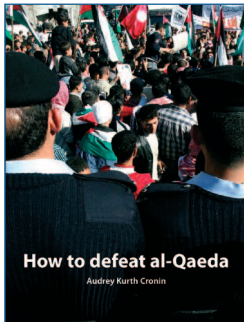

## Adelphi series

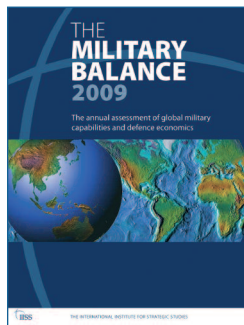
