## Submitting regular papers:

*HCI* seeks original research papers of high quality and broad relevance that are within its Aims & Scope. *HCI* is an interdisciplinary journal, and so all papers must have both scientific results – how technology is actually used – and relevance for how systems should be designed.

*HCI* favors substantial papers based on extensive research rather than shorter papers, papers based on narrowly-focused issues, papers of only specialized interest, or papers reporting preliminary results.

Theoretical, framework, or review papers, or even essays, are welcomed; but they are expected to develop new concepts, present rigorous analysis, and show relevance to design. Papers articulating new or "non-standard" perspectives are also welcome.

Send your submission via email to the Administrative Editor, Patricia Sheehan (<u>patricia.sheehan@parc.com</u>). Word or PDF file formats are preferred, but any readable format is acceptable for initial submission and reviewing.

As a convenience, you can download a <u>Word template</u> for your paper. Final manuscripts will be expected to conform to the *HCI* journal style, which is described in the <u>Guidelines for Final Submissions</u>.

## Submitting papers to special issues:

Submission to a special issue has the same requirements as for regular submission, plus the topical and temporal constraints of the special issue. See the Call for Participation.
