## JOB OPPORTUNITIES

### RESEARCH ASSOCIATE

The James Martin Center for Nonproliferation Studies (CNS) in Monterey, California, invites applications for a full-time research associate dealing with nuclear nonproliferation issues. This position will entail research, analysis, writing, and lecturing on nuclear nonproliferation and related security issues involving both state and non-state actors. In addition to an appointment at CNS, there may be opportunities to teach at the Monterey Institute of International Studies.

**Requirements.** The search is open in regard to topic and region, although currently CNS has special interests in attracting nonproliferation and security policy experts on the Middle East, Russia, and East Asia, as well as candidates with advanced degrees in science. Priority will be given to individuals with a PhD or equivalent work experience and in-country research in one or more geographic regions outside of the United States. Excellent writing skills and demonstrated scholarship on WMD issues are required; multilingual skills are an asset.

### POSTDOCTORAL/SABBATICAL FELLOWSHIP

CNS invites applications for its 2009 postdoctoral/sabbatical fellows program. During his/her year in residence, the fellow will be expected to: (1) publish a significant work in the field of nuclear, biological, or chemical weapons proliferation/terrorism or related field; (2) contribute to ongoing research and programmatic activities at CNS; and (3) lecture in his/her area of specialty.

**Requirements.** The search is open in regard to topic and region, although currently CNS has special interests in attracting nonproliferation and security policy experts on the Middle East, Russia, and East Asia, as well as candidates with degrees in science. The applicant's PhD must be in hand before arrival. However, a predoctoral fellowship for advanced PhD students will also be considered.

#### **Duties and responsibilities** (both positions)

- Conduct research projects in the area of nuclear proliferation and other topics relevant to nonproliferation issues.
- Assist with ongoing CNS-wide nonproliferation projects.
- Lecture on nonproliferation topics.
- Publish articles and op-eds on nonproliferation issues.
- Present research results at conferences and workshops.
