Routledge seeking Co-Editor for *Ecology of Food & Nutrition*

Routledge, one of the leading international publishers of Arts, Humanities, and Social Science journals, invites applications for the co-editorship of its key journal, *Ecology of Food & Nutrition: An International Journal*.

Ecology of Food and Nutrition is an international journal of the nutritional sciences in the broadest sense. It emphasizes foods and food systems and their utilization to satisfy human nutritional needs, but it also examines nonfood factors that contribute to the spectrum of nutritional conditions, such as obesity and leanness, malnutrition vitamin requirements and mineral needs. The content scope is thus wide; articles may consider dietary and nutritional status issues arising from cultural prohibitions, traditional usages, and problems of marketing and transportation. Food nutrients and toxicants, additives and food quality are also topics considered, as are ethnobotany, agriculture and development.

The ideal candidate will be trained and have a high standing in the **fields of human nutrition, dietetics, food science and technology, and/or nutritional anthropology**. The candidate will also have excellent organizational skills and an extensive list of international contacts. S/he will work with the current Editor, Dr. Peter Pellett, as well as two other Co-Editors, Dr. Barrett Brenton and Dr. Robert T. Jackson, in developing manuscript flow and making editorial decisions.

Responsibilities of the Co-Editor:

1. The co-editor participates in establishing editorial guidelines for the journal.
2. The co-editor solicits articles for the journal by attending conferences and networking in the field, inviting scholars to submit work, and suggesting ideas for special issues or articles.
3. The co-editor receives articles submitted to the journal and manages them through the review process. This involves receiving, filing, and keeping records on each article submitted; finding two or three reviewers and sending them the article along with a reviewers form; collecting reviewers' reports; reading the manuscript and reviewers' reports and writing a decision letter for the author.
4. The co-editors work together to constitute and revise the membership of the editorial board.

Responsibilities of the Publisher:

1. The publisher copyedits, prints, and distributes the journal, manages subscriptions and promotional activities, submits the journal for inclusion into indexing/abstracting services, handles permissions requests, maintains the journal's webpage and the company website, and provides all other publishing services required to ensure the journal is achieving the highest circulation.
2. The publisher will provide the co-editor with a stipend to help defray costs associated with the co-editor's duties, a complimentary subscription for the length of the appointment, and stationery supplies, including letterhead, envelopes, return address labels, and business cards.
3. The publisher will supply the co-editor, upon request, with sample copies and brochures to be used in promoting the journal at conferences and meetings.

Qualifications of the Co-Editor:

1. A doctorate in a relevant field of humanities or social sciences, and a record of research and publication in the fields of the nutritional sciences, dietetics, food science and technology, and/or nutritional anthropology.
2. International connections. We plan to maintain the international scope and readership of *Ecology of Food & Nutrition* and seek a co-editor with the interest and qualifications to do so.
3. Institutional support as necessary.
