

THE AMOS PERLMUTTER PRIZE

The editors and publisher of *The Journal of Strategic Studies* are pleased to announce the fourth annual Amos Perlmutter Prize. The prize, named in memory of the founding editor of the journal, will recognize the best essay submitted for publication to *The Journal of Strategic Studies* by a junior faculty member (Lecturer or Assistant Professor). The winning author will receive a prize of £250 or \$500, depending on the author's country of origin.

The 2008 prize was awarded to Daniel R. Morris, for his article '**Surprise and Terrorism: A Conceptual Framework**'. His article was printed in the first issue of 2009 and is now available at our webpage [free to download](#).

The 2007 prize was awarded to Avi Kober, for his article '**The IDF in the Second Lebanon War: Why the Poor Performance?**'

The 2006 prize was awarded to David Ucko for his article '**Applying Distributed Operations To Counterinsurgency Campaigns: Insights From Malaya**'.
