## JOURNAL OF EUROPEAN PUBLIC POLICY (JEPP) PRIZES

We are pleased to announce this year's winners of the Annual JEPP prizes for the most downloaded Special Issue, the most downloaded article from that Special Issue, and the most downloaded article not from a special issue. A prize of £200 is awarded to the author(s) in each category.

In order to make the competition as fair as possible, we leave two full years between the year of assessment and the year of the awards. The prizes awarded this year are therefore for articles published in 2008, based on the number of downloads between January 2009 and December 2010.
