The *Journal of Medieval Iberian Studies* (www.informaworld.com/ribs) is a new peer-reviewed journal, published by the Taylor & Francis Group, that contains innovative scholarship on the Christian, Jewish, and Islamic cultures of the Iberian Peninsula from the fifth to the sixteenth centuries. *JMIS* encompasses archaeology, art and architecture, music, philosophy and religious studies, as well as history, codicology, manuscript studies, and the multiple Arabic, Latin, Romance, and Hebrew linguistic and literary traditions of Iberia. The editors warmly invite all participants to introduce their research and exchange ideas during the workshop, and to submit their work to the journal for peer review.
