This year, the American Planning Association celebrates its centennial. In celebration, the *Journal of the American Planning Association* and *Planning & Environmental Law* will be publishing special issues dedicated to this momentous anniversary. In the spring of 1909, the Committee on Congestion of Population in New York staged the first American conference on city planning, beginning a century of professional planning for cities and regions in the United States. The Spring 2009 special issue of *JAPA* contains articles about urban planning over the past century and prospects for the future, touching on how the inaugural conference and its organizers shaped the profession, the role of property rights in planning, the history of form-based codes, the evolution of urban freeways, the trajectory of environmental planning, migrants and their influences, neighborhood planning, the export of planning expertise to India, and housing. The issue also contains a special book review section in which members of the *JAPA* editorial board write about outstanding planning books that influenced their thinking and practice.

*JAPA* is edited by David Sawicki of the Georgia Institute of Technology, and the centennial issue was guest edited by Eugénie L. Birch of the University of Pennsylvania and Christopher Silver of the University of Florida.
