## WINS ALPSP/CHARLESWORTH BEST NEW JOURNAL AWARD 2007

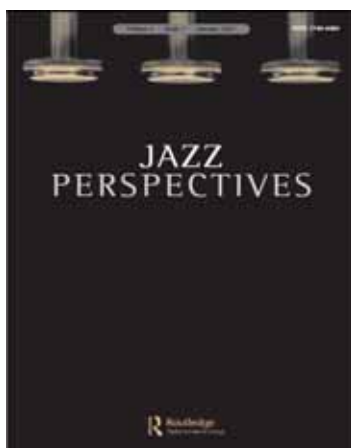
