In-text citations	
Placement	Resources in the reference list should be cited using superscripted digit. Superscripted citations should only follow terminal punctuation (e.g., periods, commas, closed quotation marks, question marks, exclamation points).
	This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature. ³
	Mention of a specific reference within the course of a sentence can be proceed by "ref." (e.g., "For a review, see ref. 20" or "For reviews, see refs. 20–25").
Multiple resources cited	When citing two resources in the same callout, separate them with a comma. No space should appear between the digits:

	This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature, experts agree. ^{3,4}
	When citing multiple resources that are not consecutively numbered in the same callout, separate them with commas. No space should appear between the digits:
	This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature, experts agree. ^{3,4,28}
	When citing span of three or more resources that are consecutively number in the same callout, include the first and last digits and separate them with an en-dash. No space should appear between the digits:
	This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature, experts agree. ^{3,4,28,29–31}
Citation with a direct quotation	Citations should be positioned outside the quotation mark that closes a passage in the running text that is drawn directly from a resource. The number of the page on which the quote is found should appear after the citation digit in "(p#)" format:
	One should live by the dictum, "Measure what is measurable, and make measurable what is not." 18(p119)
	Longer quotations (over 50 words) should be set off in a "block." Citations appear after any punctuation that ends block quotations, with a space separating the citation from the punctuation:
	make measurable what is not. ^{18(p119)}
Author names	The names of authors associated with a resource can be included in the running text along with a numerical citation:
	Wayne and Hartley ¹² write
	The citation should immediately follow the mention of the author name(s).
	The basic formats for citations with different numbers of authors are as follows:

	One author: Smith ¹²
	Two authors: Smith and Jones ¹³
	Three or more authors: Smith et al. ¹⁴
Reference list	
Order	The references should be numbered consecutively based on the order of their first citation in the text. The first reference cited is "1.," the second "2.," and so on, in sequence. The digits should not be superscripted but should be followed by periods. References should also not be repeated in the list. The same resource, in other words, should not be given a different number with each subsequent mention in the text but should be cited on these later instances using the number assigned to it in the reference list at its first citation.

	This is the first citation of Green. ²³ This is an intervening citation by a different author. ²⁴ This is a subsequent citation of the same reference by Green. ²³

Form of author name

For all authors, use initials, without periods or spaces between them, in lieu of expanded given and middle names. Include the authors' surnames in full. The listing for each author should be in inverted-order surname-first format. Commas should separate individual author names. The word "and" should not precede the final author name for reference entries with ten or fewer authors. If more than ten individuals authored a resource, the reference entry documenting the resource should list the first ten authors followed by "et al." Do not use em-dashes to replace author names if names repeat.

If an organization is the author of a resource, the full name of the organization can appear in the reference:

8. British Standards Institution.

If a resource has no author, the reference entry should begin with the title of work:

12. Authorless book title.

Titles	The titles of book references should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. The titles of book chapters, reports, and papers should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. Journal article titles should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. The titles of journals in the same reference entries, though, should appear in italics with headline style capitalization (i.e., capitalize first words of title and subtitle, as well as all nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs, regardless of length). The titles of journals, moreover, should be abbreviated in accordance with ISO 4 List of Title Word Abbreviations (LTWA) standards.
Place of publication and publisher name for books and reports	Any initial "the" and concluding "Inc.", "Ltd", "Co.", "Publishing Co.", etc. should be omitted from the publisher name in the reference entry. The place of publication should always include a state/province abbreviation or country, even if the city is a familiar one. Issue numbers and DOIs for journals	The issue number can be omitted if the journal is paginated consecutively through the volume (or if month or season is included), but it is not incorrect to include it. When volume and issue number alone are used, the issue number is within parentheses. If only an issue number is used, it is not within parentheses.
	DOIs are standard elements of journal reference entries. Authors, though, are not required to retrieve DOIs for references.
In press	"Forthcoming" should be used in lieu of a publication year for any in-press references.

Pagination	With page ranges, include all digits, even if the end page number repeats the thousand and/or hundred digit(s) found in the first page number. Insert "p." before the page range in book chapter references.
