In the text citations	
Basic citation format	<p>Resources in the reference list should be cited using digits in parentheses (e.g., (1), (2)). Citations should precede terminal (e.g., periods, commas, closed quotation marks, question marks, exclamation point) and nonterminal punctuation (e.g., semicolons, colons). Reference numbers should not be placed in parentheses.</p> <p>This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature (3).</p>
Multiple resources cited	<p>When citing two resources in the same callout, place them in the same parentheses and separate them with a comma:</p> <p>This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature, experts agree (3, 4).</p>

	<p>When citing multiple resources that are not consecutively numbered in the same callout, include all the digits within the same parentheses and separate them with commas:</p> <p>This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature, experts agree (3, 4, 28).</p> <p>When citing span of three or more resources that are consecutively number in the same callout, include the first and last digits and separate them with an en-dash:</p> <p>This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature, experts agree (3, 4, 28, 29–31).</p>
Citation with a direct quotation	<p>Citations should be positioned outside the quotation mark that closes a passage in the running text that is drawn directly from a resource:</p> <p>One should live by the dictum, "Measure what is measurable, and make measurable what is not" (18).</p> <p>Longer quotations (over 50 words) should be set off in a "block." Citations appear after any punctuation that ends block quotations, with a space separating the citation from the punctuation:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">... make measurable what is not. (18)</p> <p>The reference associated with the citation should feature the number of the page on which the quote is found.</p>
Author names	<p>The names of authors associated with a resource can be included in the running text along with a numerical citation. A numerical citation, though, should not be used as a substitute for author names.</p> <p><u>Correct</u> Wayne and Hartley (12) write ...</p> <p><u>Incorrect</u> (12) write.</p> <p>The citation should immediately follow the mention of the author name(s).</p>

	<p>The basic formats for citations with different numbers of authors are as follows:</p> <p>One author: Smith (12)</p> <p>Two authors: Smith and Jones (13)</p> <p>Three or more authors: Smith et al. (14)</p>
Tables and figures	Resources cited in tables or figure legends should follow the standard format and must be included in the reference list.
Reference list	
Order	<p>The references should be numbered consecutively based on the order of their first citation in the text. The first reference cited is "1.," the second "2.," and so on, in sequence. The digits should not be superscripted but should be followed by periods. References should also not be repeated in the list. The same resource, in other words, should not be given a different number with each subsequent mention in the text but should be cited on these later instances using the number assigned to it in the reference list at its first citation.</p> <p><u>Example</u></p> <p>This is the first citation of Green (23). This is an intervening citation by a different author (24). This is a subsequent citation of the same reference by Green (23).</p> <p>References</p> <p>23. Green ML. Journal article.</p> <p>24. Form of author name	<p>For all authors, use initials, without periods or spaces between them, in lieu of expanded given and middle names. Include the authors' surnames in full. The listing for each author should be in inverted-order surname-first format. Commas should separate individual author names. The word "and" should not precede the final author name for reference entries with ten or fewer authors. If more than ten individuals authored a resource, the reference entry documenting the resource should list the first ten authors followed by "et al." Do not use em-dashes to replace author names if names repeat.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 10 Authors</u></p> <p><u>Format:</u> #. Titles	<p>The titles of book references should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. The titles of book chapters, reports, and papers should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. Journal article titles should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. The titles of journals in the same reference entries, though, should appear in italics with headline style capitalization (i.e., capitalize first words of title and subtitle, as well as all nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs, regardless of length). The titles of journals, moreover, should be abbreviated in accordance with US National Library of Medicine (NLM)/MEDLINE standards.</p>
Place of publication and publisher name for books and reports	<p>Any initial "the" and concluding "Inc.", "Ltd", "Co.", "Publishing Co.", etc. should be omitted from the publisher name in the reference entry. The place of publication should always include a state/province abbreviation or country, even if the city is a familiar one.</p> <p>Cambridge (MA): Harvard University Press Cambridge (UK): Cambridge University Press New York (NY): Macmillan Englewood Cliffs (NJ): Prentice Hall Washington (DC): Smithsonian Institution Press Chapel Hill (NC): University of North Carolina Press</p>
Issue numbers and DOIs for journals	<p>The issue number can be omitted if the journal is paginated consecutively through the volume (or if month or season is included), but it is not incorrect to include it.</p> <p>DOIs are standard elements of journal reference entries. Authors, though, are not required to retrieve DOIs for references.</p>
In press	<p>"Forthcoming" should be used in lieu of a publication year for any in-press references.</p>
