

## Critical Reviews in Solid State and Materials Sciences

References to the literature and all notes regardless of their nature (except those in tables) should be numbered in one consecutive series, repetition of references being avoided by using the superscript number corresponding to the original reference. Reference numbers in the text should be typed as superscript numbers and follow terminal punctuation. Bibliographic references to classified documents and reports or to unpublished material not generally available to the scientific public should not be used. Literature references should be arranged and punctuated as follows:

References to books should include author, title, volume, publisher, date of publication, and relevant page ranges. Thus:
