Footnotes and endnotes	
Note numbers and citation methods	Citations callouts should appear in the text as superscripted numbers, usually after terminal punctuation (e.g., periods, commas, closed quotation marks, question marks, exclamation points) in the running text:
	This phenomenon frequently occurs in nature. ¹
	The citation callout number corresponds with the superscripted note number that precedes the footnote or endnote featuring information about the cited resource(s).

	Footnotes should be placed at the bottom, or "foot," of the same page on which its corresponding citation callout appears. Endnotes should be gathered at the end of the document under the heading, "Notes."

	Citation callouts and notes must be numbered sequentially throughout the text, starting with "1." Compound callouts, like the one shown below, should be avoided:

	Only one callout should be positioned at a single point of citation. The note corresponding to this single callout can feature information for multiple resources, with each entry separated by a semicolon:

Form of author name	Include the authors' given names and surnames in full. Commas should separate individual names if three or more authors are listed. The word "and" should precede the final author name for reference entries. If more than ten individuals authored a resource, the reference entry documenting the resource should list the first ten authors followed by "et al."

Titles	The titles of book chapters and journal articles should appear in Roman font and quotation marks with headline style capitalization (i.e., capitalize first words of title and subtitle, as well as all nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs, regardless of length). The titles of books, journals, and reports should appear in italics with headline style capitalization. The titles of book chapters and journal articles should appear in Roman font and quotation marks. The titles of journals, moreover, should appear in full; they should not be abbreviated.
Place of publication and publisher name for books and reports	Where two cities are given as a book's or report's place of publication, include the first one only in the reference entry. If the city could be confused with another, add the abbreviation of the state, province, or country:

	Englewood Cliffs, NJ: Prentice Hall
	Washington, DC: Smithsonian Institution Press
	When the publisher's name includes the state name, the state abbreviation is not needed:

	Any initial "the" and concluding "Inc.", "Ltd", "Co.", "Publishing Co.", etc. should be omitted from the publisher name in the reference entry.
DOIs for journals	DOIs are standard elements of journal reference entries. Authors, though, are not required to retrieve DOIs for references.
In press	"Forthcoming" should be used in lieu of a publication year for any in-press references.

Pagination	When citing a range of pages in a note, omit the thousand and/or hundred digit(s) found in the second page number if the digit(s) repeat the thousand and/or hundred digit(s) in the first page number: ⁷³ Fi M. Nguyen and Layla N. Anh, "Title of Journal Article," Journal Title 1, no. 6 (2017), 1137–38. *** If an online journal employs e-location or a similar
	identification system in lieu of pagination, the journal's method should be retained for the reference entry.
